As you know, the purpose of the Summer Institute is to prepare you for your fall experience and entire college career. This includes learning your own rights as well as responsibilities as a college student.

College students are a valuable part of the overall St. John Fisher community. By working together and observing shared rules and standards, our students are prepared for life after college. During the Summer Institute, your dorm will be your community, and there are rules that you must abide by.



Times for visits are limited to Sundays only, between the hours of Noon and 5:00 pm. Please share this information with people you anticipate will want to see you over the course of the five weeks.

Under no circumstances can you have overnight guests. Again, let us think of everyone's safety during our time together. If you have a family member who wants to come and visit, they will need to make their own personal hotel accommodations if they plan to stay in Rochester. They will not be permitted to sleep in the residence hall.

In addition, all guests must sign-in, and co-ed guests/dorm residents (if in room) must leave the door open 100%.
